► CARING FACULTY & PERSONAL ATTENTION

Milligan has more than 65 full-time faculty with career-based experience and academic credentials from well-respected colleges and prestigious universities. More than 70 percent hold a Ph.D. or the highest degree in their field. A low student-faculty ratio and small classes offer personal attention from mature and caring Christian scholars.

► ENRICHED QUALITY OF LIFE

Students at Milligan are part of a dynamic, close-knit campus of nearly 900 students from more than 40 states and 10 nations. Close to 85 percent of traditional students live on campus in one of six residence halls.

Milligan enriches its community with an assortment of art, musical, and cultural activities, many of which are open to the public. A regional powerhouse in athletics, Milligan has won more than 16 conference titles and qualified for 12 NAIA national championship berths since 1995. More than 25 student organizations provide opportunities for every student to make a difference and prepare for leadership roles in the community, church and workplace.

► SERVANT LEADERSHIP

What makes Milligan stand out from other schools is a commitment to servant leadership. At the core of the college's vision and mission is a belief that leadership is about service. Students actively serve in mission and service projects, and many classes incorporate service learning into the curriculum.

Throughout Milligan's academic programs, students examine what it means to be a Christian in today's society. Students are also encouraged to broaden their faith through weekly chapels, convocations, vespers, prayer groups and Bible studies.

► OUR GRADUATES

More than 90 percent of our graduates are employed full-time, attending graduate school, or in full-time volunteer ministry within six months of graduation. Over the past 12 years, more than 75 percent of our pre-med students who took the MCAT were accepted into medical school—almost twice the national average. Among our 10,000-plus alumni are leaders who proudly call Milligan College their *alma mater*.
