Miller Analogies Test

Test Section

The *Miller Analogies Test* (MAT) is a high-level analytic ability test requiring the solution of problems stated as analogies. Most of the analogies on the MAT are verbal analogies, and a few are quantitative. The test consists of 100 partial analogies that are to be completed in 50 minutes.

The MAT is intended to assess your ability to recognize relationships between ideas, your fluency in the English language, and your general knowledge of literature, philosophy, history, science, mathematics, and fine arts. No foreign-language edition of the MAT is available. You are not permitted to use a dictionary or any other reference aid when taking the MAT.

Fees

All payments are due in advance at the time of registration. Payments may be made by check, credit card or money order.

- \$70 for the paper/pencil MAT
- \$70 for retaking the MAT
