## IN-DEMAND PROFESSION

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), employment of occupational therapists is expected to increase by more than 30 percent through 2020, much faster than the average for all occupations. The average annual salary for occupational therapists is over \$76,000.

To that end, Milligan's MSOT program will prepare you with critical thinking and clinical skills to assume leadership roles in clinical practice, administration, research, and education. Partnerships with regional, state, and national health care systems; hospitals, clinics; and non-profit, community-based organizations provide a wide range of professional experiences for our MSOT students.

## CURRICULUM & SCHEDULE

This graduate degree is a full-time, two-and-a-half year program, including fieldwork experiences. Courses meet four days a week (Monday through Thursday). The 79-hour curriculum includes coursework in three essential components:

### BASIC SKILLS

This component is foundational and includes applied science courses, research methods and design, and an introduction to the profession of occupational therapy.

### OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY PROCESS

The core includes the study of occupation, typical life span development, and wellness integrated with the theories and methods of OT. Major topics dealing with disease processes, impacts of dysfunction, wellness, assessment, intervention, and adaptation are incorporated.

### CAPSTONE EXPERIENCES

Capstone topics include administration and leadership, professional development, directed research, and Level II Fieldwork. Students also are expected to complete an original research or graduate project.

## FIELDWORK

The occupational therapy program requires students to participate in both Level I and II fieldwork experiences. Our students are given opportunities in diverse settings and locations allowing them to form a cohesive understanding of occupational therapy through fostering servant leadership and developing professional behaviors.

## CARING FACULTY

Teaching you is more than a job to our faculty – it’s a mission. Our faculty are dedicated Christian professionals who go above and beyond to challenge you to stretch your mind. They bring real world experience into the classroom every day because they continue to work in the fields they teach. Through small class sizes that provide personal interaction with faculty, as well as hands-on lab and community immersion experiences, students are prepared to lead, direct, and deliver occupational therapy services to underserved populations.

## NATIONAL CERTIFICATION

As a graduate of our program, you will be eligible to sit for national certification examination, administered by the National Board of Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT). After successful completion of this exam, you will be an Occupational Therapist Registered (OTR). Most states require licensure in order to practice; however, state licenses are often based on the results of the NBCOT Certification Exam.
