¹ Each student who selects a major in Humanities works with the Director of Humanities to design a program to meet the needs and desires of the individual student. The capstone course, HUMN 490, needs to be worked out with the Director of Humanities the semester before the student intends to enroll.

Courses in the major must be junior and senior level work from the disciplines of history, literature, humanities, philosophy, fine arts, foreign language, and Bible (not 471). (Up to three selected 200 level courses can be counted toward the major, including HIST 209 and 210, HUMN 285, BIBL 201 and 202. For a complete list, consult the Director of Humanities.)
