Emmanuel Christian Seminary at Milligan is accredited by The Commission on Accrediting of the Association of Theological Schools in United States and Canada.

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Master of Christian Ministries Degree

Master of Christian Ministries Graduation rate: At its 2024 Commencement, Milligan College conferred 11 Master of Christian Ministries degrees (2023, 9; 2022, 13; 2021, 10; 2020, (Covid); 2019, 10; 2018, 4; 2017, 4; 2016, 4; 2015, 12; 2014, 1, 2013, N/A).

Retention/Completion Rate: Based on a Fall 2020 MACM incoming class of 1 students, the number of students completing their MACM degree within four years was 1 (100%). Of MACM students entering in 2020 who did not graduate with a MACM degree, 0 switched and completed another seminary degree, and 0 are no longer attending.

Graduate Student Questionnaire: 100% (1 of 1) students graduating from the MACM degree completed the standardized Association of Theological Schools Commission on Accrediting (ATS) “Graduating Student Questionnaire” (GSQ) which indirectly assesses their “satisfaction with progress of skills related to future work” through ratings on a scale of 1-5.
