


"Baroque, Blues, and Broadway" Milligan Orchestra Concert

The inevitable revelation of the crime results in an unexpected reaction from Torvald. Rather than being grateful to Nora, he is incapable of accepting the pride and self-sufficiency she demonstrated in taking care of him, and he accuses her of damaging his good name. The illusions behind their marriage are exposed, and Nora wakes to feelings of self awareness for the first time in her life. Torvald is not the man she thought she knew.
